"Weeds"

We have recently read many parables in Matthew that dealt with farming the land and of course weeds came into the parable too. I like to have a small garden in the summer so I can enjoy fresh tomatoes, cucumbers, grape tomatoes to name just a few.



My garden is different from the ones described in Matthew Chapter 13, but alike too. This statement seems confusing so let me explain myself.

I chose good seeds and plants for my garden. I generally buy my seeds and plants from Home Depot because of the success I've had over the years. I have in past years tried to use only seeds to grow my vegetables, but unfortunately many of them never sprouted. One time I did have success with grape tomato seeds, and I placed the seedlings outside for sunshine. To my dismay, the wind was strong that day and my seedlings succumbed to the wind, and they died. It was a great disappointment to care for the seedlings and to have them die so quickly. I decided to try to plant seeds again this year using a different technique I read about on Pinterest. I saved the materials needed for the project and bought new seeds. I collected paper rolls from toilet paper, bought new potting soil and I knew this year I would have success. I'm still waiting for the plants to sprout! I'm going to do more research and reading and hopefully I'll be successful next year.

As I stated, my garden is different from the ones in the Bible too. I don't plant my vegetables in the ground, but in buckets. As in the parable of the Sower, my soil is a mixture of rock and clay, and my yard is shady part of the day. Using the buckets, I can select the best spot for my vegetables to grow. I also use good potting soil formulated for plants, water during the morning hours but not too much and use natural fertilizers. This year my garden was very successful, and I was able to share with neighbors and family.

One thing in common to my garden and those in the Bible was WEEDS. I found the weeds grew around the buckets, so I needed to pull them up. I didn't let the weeds stay like the parable we read. I didn't want the weeds to take over and affect my vegetables. I was very thankful that no weeds came up in the buckets this year, but my flower beds are a different story.

As I thought about the parable, my garden and life, I realized that weeds are a part of my life. I've had many wonderful life experiences and sad ones too. Weeds are a part of everyone's life, and how you use the garden tools of life such as prayer, attending church, reading your Bible, having faith helps get rid of those things I need to change in my life. Weeds can be disguised as envy for something your neighbor has, love of material things and being deceitful to family, friends and co-workers. The list is long, and you understand what I'm trying to

say here. During our worship service, we pause for silence and self-examination of what we've done the previous week, and this is an excellent opportunity to pull weeds.

See you Sunday and let's pull those weeds!
