Easter Contemplation

We are currently in the season of Lent. It is once again time to focus our attention on our Lord's journey to Calvary. Jesus knew what the outcome of his journey would be. He chose to do his Father's will even though He knew he would be the ultimate sacrifice. He endured the pain and the humiliation of the scourging, the crown of thorns, the journey to Golgotha, the spikes in his hands and feet, and the lance in his side. That sacrifice exemplifies the love of the Father and the Son. Who among us would sacrifice our only child for the sins of another? That sacrifice, provided by God to atone for our sins, provides us the way to be restored to God the Father. That sacrifice shows that God's love has no limits and is immeasurable.

It is truly difficult to imagine how alone Jesus felt standing beside Pontius Pilate. It is hard to imagine that he had the strength to stand after being beaten, scourged, spat on, and suffering the pain of all that abuse. Even knowing what the outcome would be, it must have been hurtful when the rabble was offered the choice of Jesus or Barrabas; they chose Barrabas. They had the audacity to demand that he be crucified. He was forced to carry his cross, the instrument of his death, to Golgotha. They continued to punish him during his journey to his destiny. They drafted a young man to assist him to carry the cross when he was no longer able. They drove spikes into his hands and his feet. Then they lifted him up. His crucifiers cast lots for his clothing. Even in his dying he was concerned about his mother, charging John to take Mary as his own mother, and Mary to take him as her son. He assured a thief that he would be in paradise with him that day. When he knew he had completed his Father's mission, he gave up his spirit. One of his crucifiers then put a lance in his side to be sure he was dead. In his death, we too, have died.


He was taken down from the cross and placed in a tomb. The tomb was sealed with a stone and guards placed to assure that his body was not taken away by his disciples.

The most beautiful part of our story is the resurrection of Jesus Christ. On the third day, he rose again from the dead. In his resurrection we too are resurrected. The resurrection of Jesus is critical to our faith because it demonstrates God's power over death and assures us that we too will be resurrected. Jesus humbled himself to endure the crucifixion, but that was not the end. His resurrection is the beginning of eternal life for all who believe in him.

We are humbled by God's gift of grace. He forgives our sins and restores us to a right relationship with our Heavenly Father. We are underserving of God's grace. He gives it freely even when we don't expect it.
